## **Ted Staunton**

Ted teaches the Writing Children's Fiction course at George Brown College in Toronto. His stories address issues faced by children in the classroom, the school yard, the playground or at home.

Award, Melanie provides simple,
age-appropriate introductions to
sensitive topic such as missing
Aboriginal women, residential
schools and youth suicide.

## Kyle Sylvester

This award-winning author and illustrator with a slightly twisted perspective has developed the Super Duper Monster Viewer, written the *Sports Hall of Weird* and retold the classic *Cinderella* in a completely new context.

Winner of so many Canadian and American awards for the more than 50 books he has illustrated, Bill enriches stories beyond words by his character sketches and humour details in his drawings. We have seen some drawings by Bill Slavin on programs and posters of the Stone Fence Theatre.

## Helanie Becker

Helanie is an educator and performer as well as author. Little children go crazy for her Little Jack Horner Live From The Corner and Ode to Underwear, both illustrated by Mike Boldt. Sports team and spy stories spell out special skills which lead young people along the path to self-improvement.
