This is something to celebrate! This season is going to be filled with events for the whole family! To kick off the summer, we will be hosting exciting Canada Day festivities, complete with games, activities and a photo booth! This July, take part in Archaeology Day, a special



day supported by the Ottawa Archaeological Society where people of all ages will get the opportunity to learn about the rich cultural history of the Valley, and experience what it's like to be an archaeologist! Throughout the summer we will be hosting multiple performances by local musicians from the Valley and from across Canada! We also have an exciting new Discovery Program rolling out at Bonnechere, focused on exploratory learning in

our natural environment. Come visit us at one of our Drop-ins! In addition, this August marks the 25th anniversary of our annual Wolf Howl, featuring renowned biologist and wildlife photographer Michael Runtz. You definitely won't want to miss an opportunity for such unique interaction with this amazing species! Our gates open to the public Friday, May 18th this year and we hope to see you and your family here! You can borrow a day pass to explore Bonnechere for free from the KHR or Barry's Bay libraries, and from the Community Resource Centre or Friendship Centre in Killaloe. 2017 was a huge year at Renfrew County ATV (RCATV) club with significant growth and big trail projects, but we are pretty pumped for 2018.

RCATV Map: Promoting local corporate members and partners this map is a tool with trail etiquette, safety and legislation information and helps riders plan their trips easily.

Enhanced Trail Safety: Machines are more powerful, and riders are from all over Ontario. Trails are colour-coded with technicality ratings and renumbered that make trails easier to follow. You can find trails right for your machine, skill level, comfort and riding style.

Expanded Trail Systems: We now maintain 750km of Trails/250km of Routes so riders to get from trail to trail and into communities for amenities. Trails are re-named with historic/cultural Ottawa Valley pride like Pakotina and Bonnechere Trails.

Preparation is everyone's responsibility

Emergency Preparedness Week is a national awareness initiative that has taken place annually since 1996. It is a collaborative event undertaken by provincial and territorial emergency management organizations supporting activities at the local level, in concert with Public Safety Canada and partners. Emergency Preparedness Week encourages Canadians to take three simple steps to become better prepared to face a range of emergencies:

- **Know the risks**
- **Make a plan**
- **Get an emergency kit**

When it comes to being prepared for an emergency, we all have a role to play. You should be prepared to take care of yourself and your family for a minimum of 72 hours during an emergency. Know the basic principles of first aid and have basic supplies available. By definition, emergencies happen when we don't expect them and often when families are not together. Suddenly, you need to think about your kids at school or elderly parents across town. If phones don't work or some streets aren't accessible, what would you do?

Having a family emergency plan will save time and make real situation less stressful.

Elections Information

Thinking of running for municipal office or school trustee in Ontario? The nomination period time for filing is from May 1st, 2018 to July 27th, 2018. From May 1st to July 26th you can file at the municipal office between the hours of 8:30 am - 4:30 pm and on Nomination Day; July 27th, you can file at the municipal office between the hours of 9:00am - 2:00pm. Please Note In 2017 the Province of Ontario passed legislation to amend the Municipal Elections Act, 1996. One of the changes was that, for the 2018 municipal election a candidate would require

25 signatures to endorse their Nomination Form. In April 2018, the Province of Ontario amended this legislation to exclude municipalities with under 4000 electors, therefore, candidates for municipal council in Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards do not require this endorsement.
