# Tourism Centre Earns Award OHTO recognition shared by community

The Township's Visitor Information Centre has been recognized for achieving the OHvation Customer Service Leader designation, as offered by the Ontario's **Highlands Tourism** Organization (OHTO). The Visitor Information Centre participated in a regional mystery shopping program that was designed to anonymously assess the quality of customer service provided to visitors, including the important role of tourism ambassadors to the

meeting industry service standards, you have contributed to elevating the calibre of customer service offered to visitors in Ontario's Highlands."

The evaluation included feedback from the mystery shoppers who remarked on the Visitor Information Centre being clean and in good repair. The mystery shoppers noted the hanging plants, arrangement of tourism information inside the Centre and that the washroom

was clean.

One suggestion was that a sign should be erected on the highway to let tourists know that a Visitor Information Centre was available.

Overall the Centre scored 84 per cent, achieving 134.5 out of a possible 160 points. The highest levels of scoring went to the staff attitudes and

presentation, as well as the knowledge of the regional tourism industry.

"Tourism is a very important industry in our community, and we are very proud to have been recognized with this designation," said Mayor Janice Visneskie Moore. "We share this with our residents who are a great part of our ability to provide tourists with a reason to visit Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards."
