Delegations: Joel Helmer, co-owner of Paradisio Bees was in attendance and was asked to address council. Mr. Helmer stated that he is representing approximately 10 local businesses who are working on several projects and in the process of developing a Business Improvement Area (BIA) for the Township. Mr. Helmer stated the group has established a business plan and currently focusing on entrance signs to divert traffic off Highway 60 and into the Village. He stated Community Development Officer Neff has been instrumental in assisting with the permit application process through MTO and has contacted key landowners for permission to erect signs on their property. Mr. Helmer stated the BIA has established a 4-year budget with \$4,800 committed in 2021 for signage. Mr. Helmer stated the group is confident going forward they will be able to fund their proposed commitments from 2022 on and is looking for council's support of 50% for signage. Mr. Helmer stated that Community Development Officer Neff has been very instrumental in this project, and it is a pleasure to work with him. Community Development Officer Neff presented aerial drawings showing where the signs will be placed.

Fire Chief Bob Gareau reported on the following:

Activities of Note: Attended the following meetings: MNRF Fireland Operational Training, PAC 6 virtual meeting, COVID 19 Ministry meetings, fire committee meetings, weekly EOCG meetings and fire hall meetings. Fire calls: Brush fire on Windermere Lane, smoke under hood on Buck hill, hydro lines down on Mountain View Road, car fire on Simpson Pit. Update on COVID-19 statistics locally, provincially, nationally and international along with Vaccination statistics.

Mayor Tiedje stated that Fire Captains Ken Shulist and Jim McClement were invited to explain their position and reasons before full council on an operational review and change to move the tanker fire truck currently housed at the Works Garage to the new Killaloe

Fire Hall. Mayor Tiedje advised that the Fire Committee met to discuss this issue, however the fire committee members were not unanimous in a decision. Mayor Tiedje turned the floor over to Fire Chief Gareau who provided an update and history on the operations of the fire department, specifically the decision to house the tanker at the Works Garage. After a lengthy discussion on this issue, council voted to leave the tanker truck at the Works garage. Council thanked Mr. Shulist and Mr. McClement for attending, at which time they left the meeting.

Works Superintendent Dean Holly reported on the following:

- Loader has been repaired.
- "A" gravel has been applied on a section of Deer Trail Road and locates are completed on Lisk Road to start work next week on ditching, culvert replacement and gravelling.
- Meeting with BEI regarding the gravel tender and expect crushing to start early lune.
- Working on the road construction tenders and first load of calcium is expected next week.
- One summer student started this week, the Cameron Street Bridge has been paved and the light fixture on Cameron Street will be reinstalled next week.
- Working on a solution at the boat launch and any work around the water will require a permit from MNRF.
- Waste Management Controlled fire at the waste site was better. Reminder to taxpayers to ensure that only recyclables materials are placed in the blue box for pick-up.
