The Council for the Township of Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards met on the above date with Councillors Ted Browne, John Jeffrey, Brian Pecoskie, Stanley Pecoskie, Carl Kuehl and Debbie Peplinskie present. In the absence of Mayor Janice Visneskie Moore, the CAO/Clerk-Treasurer opened the meeting and called the members to order.

Motion for Debbie Peplinskie to chair the meeting in the Mayor's absence. Carried.

<u>Pecuniary/Financial Interest:</u> Councillors Brian Pecoskie, Debbie Peplinskie and Ted Browne advised that they have pecuniary interest in agenda items, and will declare at the appropriate time in the meeting.

Minutes:

Motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of Council on October 30, 2017, Open and Closed sessions. Carried.

Delegations:

Kathy Walsh was present and asked permission to decorate Station Park next year for Christmas. She advised that she has several people who are interested in helping, and that she has already received donations of decorations. She also confirmed that she and other volunteers would put up and take down the decorations. Council supported the proposal made by Ms. Walsh, and advised that the volunteers are required to follow the municipal volunteer registration process. Council also agreed that the township would contact an electrician with regard to the possibility of installing more outlets in the park, and asked staff to contact the municipal insurance company with regard to liability questions. Ms. Walsh thanked Council and left the table.

Garnet Kranz, Rachel Clayton and Lynn Postill were present and were invited to address council. Mr. Kranz thanked Council and staff for their cooperation and work with the Killaloe-Hagarty-Richards Heritage & Ecology Society and Hoch Park over the past year. He reported that about 75% of the new parking lot has been completed, and requested an additional 15 loads of pit run gravel for next year to complete this project. Ms. Postill reported on market activities over the past year, and Ms. Clayton reported on the museum initiatives. Ms. Clayton also reported that they want to build a small shed next to the pond, and are hoping for a donation of a small log cabin/shed/barn, which they will reconstruct at the site and use for displaying artifacts. Mr. Kranz reported that they are looking for a grant for the installation of indoor washrooms. He also advised that they will ask the CBO to conduct a site visit and review their plans for the buildings, after which they will come back to council for approval. Council agreed to sign the lease for another five-year period, and to provide the 15 loads of pit run gravel that Mr. Kranz had requested. Council thanked Mr. Kranz, Ms. Clayton and Ms. Postill for their report.

Terry Wall, Trails Director and Teresa Gamble, President of Renfrew County ATV Club were present and were invited to address Council. Ms. Gamble reviewed the activities of the club over the past year. She reviewed the areas in Killaloe, Hagarty and Richards where the club wants to formalize trail agreements with the municipality so that the trails can be added to the maps that are being prepared in this regard. This will also allow the club to sign and maintain the trails, and will provide increased trail access in the municipality. Council agreed to review the MOU that had been provided by the club. Council thanked Ms. Gamble and Mr. Wall for the presentation, at which time they left the meeting.

Councillor Brian Pecoskie declared a conflict of interest in writing regarding the Mockingbird Road issue, and left the meeting. Joan MacLeod was present and was invited to address council. She asked Councillor Stanley Pecoskie to declare a conflict of interest and leave the meeting as well, however, Councillor Pecoskie advised that his presence did not violate conflict of interest legislation. Councillor Peplinskie read an excerpt from the legal opinion that had been received from the municipal solicitor advising that the road extension that crosses Ms. MacLeod's property is not a municipal road. The CAO/Clerk-Treasurer provided Ms. MacLeod with a copy of the letter. Several of the landowners who use the road to access their properties were also present and were given a copy of the correspondence. Ms. MacLeod advised that she did not feel that she had been provided with sufficient information when the Works Superintendent Dean Holly and Councillor Stanley Pecoskie had conducted their site visit. Mr. Holly clarified their position, in that they were waiting for the response from the solicitor, so

they could not provide her with any additional information at that time. Council thanked Ms. MacLeod for her presentation, at which time she left the meeting.

Dennis Pecoskie asked for and was provided with clarification with regard to fire services on private roads. Mr. Pecoskie and the other landowners in attendance thanked Council and left the meeting. Councillor Brian Pecoskie returned to the meeting.

Reports:

Fire Chief: Fire Chief Bob Gareau was present and gave his report. There have been seven fire calls since the last report, which consisted of two fire alarms, one bush fire, a roll-over requiring extrication, a CO alarm, a hydro pole fire, and one chimney fire.

Activities of Note: Fire Chief Gareau is working with the engineers from Stirling Engineering on the recent upgrades to the McCarthy Propane Inc. yard located at 15556 Hwy. 60 for the Level 2 Risk and Safety Management Plan.

CEMC Activities: Fire Chief Gareau attended the Provincial Emergency Management Conference in Toronto on October 24th and 25th. He reviewed the Emergency Response Plan with municipal staff, and the recommendation to the committee is that an amendment be made to the Control Group section of the plan. He also advised that the HIRA was updated due to the recent flooding, and that the Critical Infrastructure List was also updated.

Canada Day Fireworks 2018: Council gave Fire Chief Gareau permission to order the fireworks for Canada Day 2018, with a 50% down payment now and the balance on July 1, 2018, and to reduce the amount to the amount spent in 2016. Council thanked Mr. Gareau for his report, at which time he left the meeting.

Community Development Officer: Community Development Officer Bonnie Ivimey was present and gave her report. She thanked Council and staff for their help with the Remembrance Day ceremony. She advised that she has arranged for a trailer for the township to enter a float in the Santa Claus Parade. The township will be collaborating with the library on this project. Council approved the purchase of the wreaths and swags for the outdoors decorations, at the same price as last year. Council also approved the Christmas Greeting in both local papers.

Council agreed to participate in the Festival of Outdoor Rinks in 2018, with a one-day event on February 10, 2018 at the Round Lake Rink. Suggested activities at this time are sledge hockey and broomball. Council thanked Ms. Ivimey for her report, at which time she left the meeting.

Works Superintendent Dean Holly was present and gave his report. Ditching on various road has been completed over the past weeks. He attended the most recent Renfrew County Road Superintendents meeting. Information was shared with regard to working with MTO to share consulting work when they have a project in your area. Mr. Holly also advised that he is receiving access to an upgraded weather notification system, which will enable him to prepare earlier for adverse weather events. He reported that CRC has requested access to the garden shed at Station Park, to store the items that they use for their ongoing program in Station Park. Council agreed to their request.

Severances: Council discussed Severance B125/16 for Marie T. Summers, and agreed to the conveyance of a 1' strip of land adjacent to Henry Street, as per the condition outlined in the aforementioned severance application.
